Interior Official to Bring Energy Message to Newport News Area: Highlights Alternatives to Foreign Oil and Gas Dependence

WASHINGTON - America has grown increasingly reliant on oil and natural gas to fuel its economy. Today, Gasoline prices are nearly 50% higher than last summer, oil prices are at a 25-year high and natural gas prices have reached sustained high historic levels. Hurricane activity shut in oil and gas production in the Gulf of Mexico, although there was no loss of life and no significant discharge of oil. To make matters worse, domestic production is not keeping pace with increasing demand.

Minerals Management Service Director Johnnie Burton will describe what MMS, the steward of America's natural resources and manager of resource assets, is doing to address this situation, and the choices that will determine the Nation's economic future.

Ms. Burton will deliver her energy awareness message, "America's National Energy Policy – Making Choices" Tuesday, November 29, 2005, at noon to the Rotary of Newport News, Virginia.
