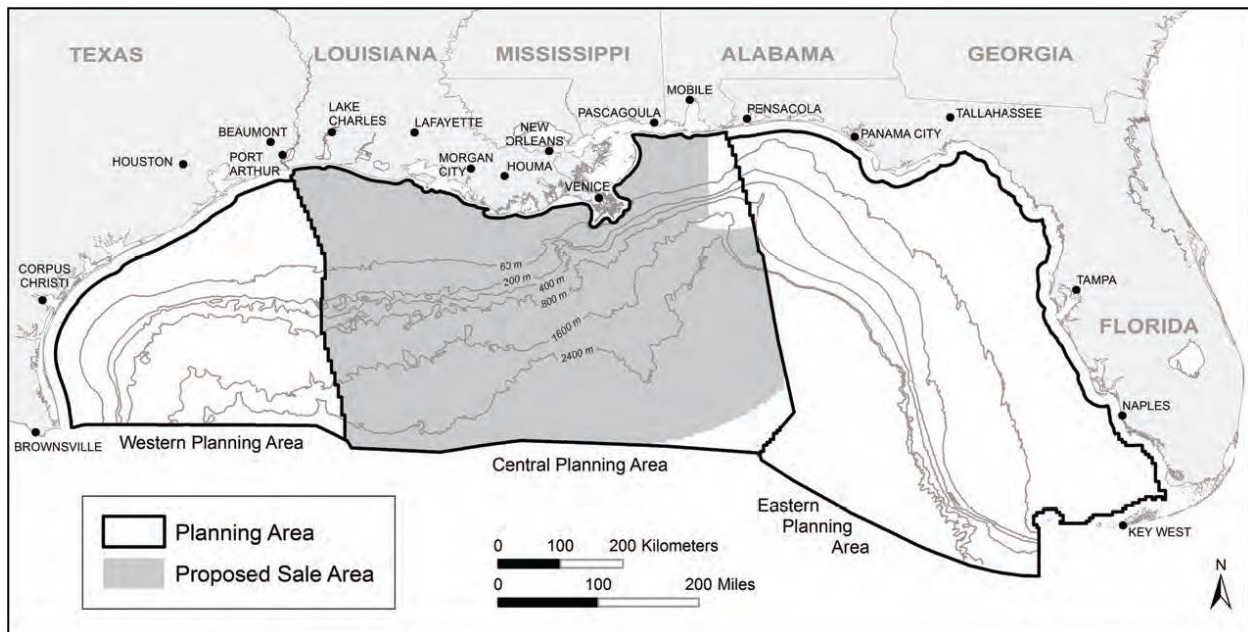

BOEM Issues a Notice of Intent to Prepare a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement and an Opportunity for Scoping Comments for Proposed Gulf of Mexico OCS Oil and Gas Central Planning Area Lease Sale 247

The Bureau of Ocean Energy Management (BOEM) shall offer for oil and gas leasing approximately 46 million acres of the total 66.45 million acres in the Central Planning Area (CPA) of the Gulf of Mexico, with the exception of the whole and portions of blocks deferred by the Gulf of Mexico Security Act of 2006 and the blocks that are beyond the United States' Exclusive Economic Zone in the area known as the northern portion of the Eastern Gap. Although the leasing of portions of the CPA (subareas or blocks) can be deferred during a Five-Year Program, the Department of the Interior is conservative throughout the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) process and includes the total area within the Gulf of Mexico for environmental evaluation.

BOEM published in the August 17, 2015, *Federal Register*, a Notice of Intent (NOI) to Prepare a Supplemental Environmental Impact Statement (EIS). The NOI seeks input on the scope of the Supplemental EIS for proposed CPA Lease Sale 247.



As part of the scoping process, BOEM's public scoping meetings will be held at the following places and times:

- **Gulfport, Mississippi:** Wednesday, September 2, 2015, Courtyard by Marriott, Gulfport Beachfront MS Hotel, 1600 East Beach Boulevard, Gulfport, Mississippi 39501, one meeting beginning at 6:00 p.m. CDT; and

- **New Orleans, Louisiana:** Thursday, September 3, 2015, Bureau of Ocean Energy Management, Gulf of Mexico OCS Region, 1201 Elmwood Park Boulevard, New Orleans, Louisiana 70123, one meeting beginning at 1:00 p.m. CDT.

In lieu of participation in the scoping meetings listed above, all interested parties, including Federal, State, Tribal, and local governments, and the general public, may submit written comments on the scope of the Supplemental EIS, significant issues that should be addressed, alternatives that should be considered, and the types of oil and gas activities of interest in the proposed lease sale area.

Written comments should be received within 30 days following the publication of the notice in the *Federal Register* in one of the following ways:

BOEM makes all comments, including the names and addresses of respondents, available for public review during regular business hours. Individual respondents may request that BOEM withhold their names and/or addresses from the public record; however, BOEM cannot guarantee that we will be able to do so. If you wish your name and/or address to be withheld, you must state your preference prominently at the beginning of your comment. All submissions from organizations or businesses and from individuals identifying themselves as representatives or officials of organizations or businesses will be made available for public inspection in their entirety.
