Resources Analyzed in the Programmatic EIS

Physical Resources



Air Quality: Condition or health of the ambient atmosphere



Water Quality: Condition or environmental health of water

Biological Resources



Coastal Communities and Habitats: Living organisms and their associated environment at the land-ocean interface



Pelagic Communities and Habitats: Living organisms and their associated environment that occur within Gulf of Mexico waters



Birds: Birds that spend at least part of their lives near the Gulf of Mexico



Benthic Communities and Habitats:Living organisms and their associated environment that occur on the seafloor



Fishes and Invertebrates: Fishes or invertebrate organisms and their associated environment that occur within the Gulf of Mexico



Marine Mammals: Mammals that spend all or part of their lives in the Gulf of Mexico



Sea Turtles: Turtles that spend most of their lives at sea and come to shore only to lay eggs

Social Resources



Commercial Fisheries: Industries that rely on harvesting fish for their livelihood



Recreational Resources: Leisure activities or visits to places of interest that contribute to the local economy



Land Use and Coastal Infrastructure: How communities use natural resources and infrastructure in their region



Recreational Fishing: Individuals that rely on harvesting fish for their enjoyment



Cultural, Historical, and Archaeological Resources: A district, site, building, structure, or object of cultural or historical significance in the marine or onshore environments



Economic Factors: Factors impacting economics in the region



Social Factors Including Environmental Justice: Social factors are the regional communities and economies of the five Gulf Coast States. Environmental justice communities are historically marginalized, low income, or minority communities.
