

The boundaries of the regular blocks are 4800 international meters on a side and contain 2,304 hectares. The regular boundaries are defined in terms of X and Y coordinates of the Universal Transverse Mercator Grid System based on the Geodetic Reference System (GRS) 1980 Ellipsoid.

Onshore planimetric base compilation is from NOS "T sheets" (1:10,000).

The areas along the dashed Commonwealth Submerged Lands Boundary have not been determined. Areas and dimensions of the irregular blocks along the zone boundary are as indicated.

This revised diagram supersedes protraction diagram ST. CROIX NE20-07, approved 04-JUN-2000.

The Territorial Submerged Lands Act Boundary, U.S. - United Kingdom Maritime Boundary, Buck Island Reef National Monument, Other TSLA Federal Areas and the Exclusive Economic Zone Limit lines depicted hereon reflect the official federal position for submerged lands jurisdiction. The areas of the fractional blocks abutting these lines have been determined and are as depicted on the Supplemental Official OCS Block Diagrams (SOBD's). Consult the SOBD's for official descriptions and approval dates.

For Exclusive Economic Zone Limit turning point information, see Federal Register, Vol. 60, No. 163, August 23, 1995. Turning points 52-56 were transformed to NAD 83/WGS 84 using NADCON v2.10 and special PRV1 grids covering between 14°N-20°N and 61°W-69°W, created for the MMS by the National Geodetic Survey, 7-APR-1999.

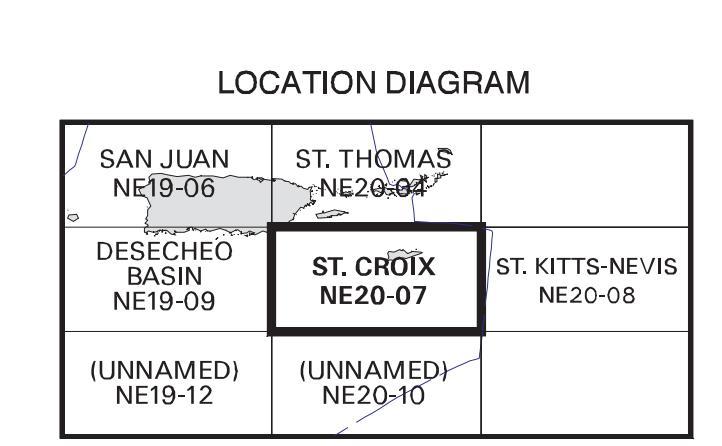
