TK IMPLEMENTATION: Establishing Arctic Community Panels of Subject Matter Experts







BOEM Information Need:

- Better integration of TK with formal science through process-oriented project to improve resource mgmt.
- Create mechanism to enhance access to TK expertise.
- Identify and organize subject matter experts from Arctic communities into working panels so they may be preauthorized to speak with authority.
- All disciplines (Phys O, Biology, Social systems) would benefit from more direct consultation and collaboration with local TK experts.





Background:

A) Relationship with Previous Work/Efforts

- Prior BOEM study, Variation in the Abundance of Arctic Cisco in the Colville River (MMS study 2007-0042) used social network analysis to establish a panel in Nuiqsut.
- PI stated that project was invaluable because local TK experts became invested in the study, and the process served as a vehicle for communicating study goals and results.





Background:

B) Relationship with Concurrent/Future Efforts

- Most western scientists working in the Arctic seek TK.
- Study would provide a formal structure to facilitate dialogue and streamline integration in transparent and credible way.
- If oil & gas exploration leads to development, the panels will enhance awareness of potential community impacts.





Objectives:

- Enhance TK authority and integration with western science by developing a functional process for western scientists to directly involve local experts through use of consistent methods.
- Provide a systematic process for scientists to integrate TK on the North Slope and make it accessible to all disciplines and entities including the State, NSF, and academia.
- Explore and expand "complementarities" available to science through TK.



Methods:

- Use social network methods to ID subject matter experts using referral techniques.
- Develop panels on 1) marine subsistence; 2) terrestrial subsistence; and 3) fishing and birding throughout North Slope communities.
- Village tribal leaders will be asked to review lists to recommend finalists.
- Provide honoraria to each subject matter panelist for participation on a study-by-study basis (paid consultants).
- Develop protocols for operational procedures.
- Partner with the NSB school district to involve youth as exofficio delegates.



Additional Pertinent Information

- Debriefing on the use of TK and panel involvement in decision-making will encourage mutually respectful dialogue between local experts and BOEM.
- Involvement of youth will facilitate cross-generational transfer of TK and promote local institutional capacity.
- Systematic social networking processes will help neutralize panels so the focus is on knowledge rather than politics, family connections, or positions on development.
- Feedback so far has been very positive.
