








Retrospective Review of the EJF

Environmental Justice Forum (EJF) Timeline






BOEM's New York Bight Timeline & EJF Touchpoints







Environmental Justice Forum - Percentage of Participants by Sector











 Authorized by Energy Policy Act of 2005, BOEM grants the right to use a lease area to develop plans

Permitting:

 BOEM decides whether to approve, approve with modification, or disapprove a Construction and Operations Plan (COP)


Upcoming Processes

Update on Final PEIS

- On Jan. 12, 2024, BOEM published a notice of availability of the Draft PEIS, opening a 45-day public comment period
 - BOEM extended the comment period by an additional 14 days in response to requests for additional review time.
 - 1,355 unique comments from 530 comment submissions.
- Final PEIS: Fall 2024
 - Edits made to address comments: Update to the EJ section and edits to the proposed Avoidance, Minimization, Mitigation, and Monitoring measure
 - Comment response summary included as an appendix
- Record of Decision: Winter 2024/2025


Future Engagement


